
# African Safari Animals Ideas Sheet

## **Additional Topics for Discussion**

- What clothing would your participants need to take on a safari? Walking shoes? Hat? Jungle vest? Rain coat? Something else?
- Would your participants enjoy traveling to Africa?
- Would your participants be scared to see safari animals up close in person? Why or why not?
- What would your participants want to see the animals doing while on a safari? Sleeping? Eating? Playing? Something else?
- Do your participants think we need to do more to protect safari animals? Why or why not?

## Possible Props (or Photos) to Bring

- Safari animal figurines or stuffed animals
- Safari hats, vests, and/or binoculars
- Pictures of safari animals

#### **Experiences Later in the Day**

- Visit the zoo with your participants
- Make safari animal face masks with your participants
- Throw a safari or jungle themed party with your participants (you can even have your participants wear their face masks!)
- Make your own African drums with animal print patterns
- Paint or color your own safari animals (and put together a safari travel guide book with your animal creations!)
- Make your own safari vests, hats, and binoculars

Golden grasslands, dense jungles, and dry deserts are all habitats of African animals. Most visitors to Africa go on a safari to see these animals in their natural habitat. Many of the species a person will see on a safari are unique to Africa.
